

# Alwyn Infant School PE and Sport Premium Funding



## 2014 - 2015

At Alwyn we pride ourselves on promoting a range of activities through the taught curriculum and extra-curricular activities which promote an active lifestyle. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

### What is the PE and Sports Premium?

The PE and Sports Premium is funding provided to schools by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture and Media and Sport and is in addition to main school funding. It is ring-fenced and as such can only be spent on the provision of PE and sport in schools.

The government provided this funding for the academic year 2013 – 2014 and the following two academic years to improve provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. Each school receives £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil calculated by reference to the number of pupils in school as recorded in the annual schools census in January.

It is for schools to decide how the PE and Sport funding is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made to enhance the provision for PE in school. Schools are held accountable for how they have used the additional funding. Ofsted now report on PE and sport provision and on how schools spend this additional funding.

### Allocation Received 2013 – 2014

£8,515.00

We spent this funding on:

- Football coaches at lunchtime.
- Specialist sports coaches during timetabled PE sessions in Year2.
- Joining the Local Authority Sports Partnership which gives us access to expertise and coaching.

**IMPACT:**

- New ball skills developed alongside competition.
- High quality specialist teaching provided.
- Dance Festival participated.
- Teacher training opportunities.
- Links developed with other coaching providers.

**Allocation for 2014 – 2015**

£9,040.00 (received throughout the academic year)

**SPENDING PROPOSALS:**

- Hiring specialist sports coaches to work with teachers when teaching PE (gymnastics, games and dance)
- Introducing new initiatives such as *The Golden Mile*, providing additional competition opportunities.
- Improving playground facilities by 'zoning' the playground into different playing/games/PE areas to further develop PE/sports skills.
- Providing cover to release teachers for professional development in PE/sport.
- Buying quality assured programs of study for enhancing the PE curriculum. We are currently looking at Val Sabin teaching resources (CD ROM and medium term planning).

**EXPECTED IMPACT:**

- Providing pupils with opportunities to try new sports.
- Lesson observation will gauge high quality of teaching and learning in P.E.
- Pupil questionnaires will show increased pupil interest in sport.
