Try to keep reading during the summer break

It is important to keep reading to your child, with your child and to encourage your child to keep practising their phonics and to read independently. On this page you will find some great ideas to help everyone to keep reading

Visit the local library

It's free and children love choosing their own books to read. Remember if the book your child chooses to read is challenging for them to read independently then read it to them or share the reading. Lots of libraries have free storytelling events and competitions so look out for those too.

Remember to take part in the summer reading challenge!

Video stories

To keep an interest in books going over the holidays, visit the [Share a Story Corner](#). It has loads of video stories you can enjoy together and talk about. You could also visit [Cbeebies stories](#) or a great range of audiobooks can be found at [World of Stories](#).

Street Signs out and about

When you are out and about in the car, on the bus or out for a walk, see how many signs you can spot. Road signs, street signs, shop signs and timetables ...

Read them together with your child.

Reading to other members of the family

Children love to share reading skills with family members so if you are visiting family then take reading books with you so someone different can say how proud they are hearing your child read. It's a good chance to show off their skills!

Family meal times

Often during holiday time, families can spend longer over meal times or might visit a café or restaurant. Read the menu whilst you are choosing what to eat or read the cereal packet over breakfast. Or if you have friends visiting for a meal then get your child to create name places for each person - make them fun and personal so each person feels special.

Postcards, cards and e-cards

Ask family and friends to write your child postcards whilst they are away on their holidays. Children love to read a postcard addressed to them. You could also send a postcard to their new class!

Cooking your favourite dish

Does your child enjoy cooking? Find a recipe, read the list of ingredients together, visit the shops and read the food labels, and then support your child to read the instructions as you make your favourite recipe.

Playing outside

When you're in your garden or at the local park, play some fun games. As your child comes down the slide or is swinging on a swing ask: What does slide begin with? What is a word beginning with t? Spell your name! Give me a word that rhymes with den!

What is the Summer Reading Challenge?

The Summer Reading Challenge is a fun, free way for children aged 4–11 to stay motivated to read during the summer holidays.

Children set their own reading goal and can read anything they enjoy.

Why should my child sign up?

One in four children hasn't reached the expected level of reading by the age of 11 and many will struggle to keep up at secondary school, despite reading for pleasure being one of the single biggest indicators of children's development.

The Summer Reading Challenge provides:

- Amazing way to boost confidence and self-esteem.
- They will be better prepared to return to school in the autumn.
- The Challenge supports the move into a new year group.
- The library provides free access to books and fun family activities all through the summer.

Your child will be part of a UK-wide programme developed by The Reading Agency and delivered in partnership with the public library network.

How can my child take part? (Library or online)

At the library:

- Visit your local library to sign up.
- Set a summer reading goal and choose from books, eBooks, or audiobooks
- Receive a special sticker booklet and collect rewards for reading

Or online:

- Visit summerreadingchallenge.org.uk
- Sign up, set a reading goal, and get book recommendations
- Unlock digital badges and earn a printable certificate



When does it start?

- In RBWM libraries it starts on Saturday 12 July
- Use the Find a Library to locate your nearest library.

What have Reception been learning this week?

This week in Reception we have been consolidating our learning in Maths and Phonics. We have been writing the letter sounds for each of the phonic sounds we have learnt this year. In PSHE and Science we have been learning about life stages of humans from baby to toddler, toddler to child, child to teenager, teenager to adult and adult to elderly person. In Book Time we have innovated our own story based on Mr Gumpy's outing and planned our outing to Courthouse field. We have been celebrating our time in Reception and talking about moving up to year 1.

Ask me to tell you about my design for my dream playground.

Ask me to tell you about the life stages of a human from baby to adult.

Ask me what I can do now that I couldn't do when I was a baby.

Ask me to retell the story of Mr Gumpy's outing.

Ask me about our outing to Courthouse school field.

Ask me to show you odd and even numbers.

What have Year 1 been learning this week?

We have had an exciting week in Year 1. In maths, we've been recapping previous learning including; money and fact families. In English, we wrote our own versions of Katie in London story, based on Maidenhead. The children did so well! In geography, we've been exploring the streets of London and seeing how busy they are with people, vehicles and buildings. We further explored London buildings by having a go at drawing them in art.

Ask me to tell you the fact families for 5,3 and 8.

Ask me to tell you about my story that was based in Maidenhead.

Ask me to tell you what the tallest building in London is.

Ask me to tell you where in London you'd be able to watch theatre shows outside.

What have Year 2 been learning this week?

Year 2 have been busy rehearsing for the upcoming leaver's concert. Look out for a letter in book bags today indicating which part of the hall parents need to sit in in order to get the best view of your child. We've also really enjoyed researching information on the 'Kenyan Big Five' animals. We have used a variety of sources including the internet, books and videos to find out some fascinating facts, including that rhinos communicate through their pool!

Ask me to name the Big 5.

Ask me a fact about rhinos.

Ask me a fact about buffalos.

Ask me a fact about lions.

Ask me a fact about leopards.

Ask me a fact about elephants.

Ask me what the definition of wildlife is.

Ask me ways in which we can protect wildlife in our local area.

Ask me to name some wildlife that can be found around our school.

The School Gates

The Alwyn and Courthouse gates open at 8.40am until 8.55am and 3.10pm until 3.35pm

The opening times allow movement between our two schools and provide different points of access which should help with traffic and parking in our area.

The gate opening times are different from the time your child is required to be in school.

The Importance of Being on Time

Reception children need to be in school at 8.45am.

Year 1 and 2 children need to be in school at 8.50am.

The classroom doors will open at these times and close as soon as the last child in the line enters the classroom; this usually takes less than 3 minutes. Any child arriving after the classroom door is shut, will be marked as late. Knocking on the classroom door once it is closed is disruptive to the children as their teacher is having to keep opening the door instead of settling their class for the morning.

Please be on time every morning. It can be worrying for a child to enter a classroom late especially when their classmates are sat on the carpet ready to learn. All children should have come into school, put their belongings in the cloakroom, their book bag in their drawer and their water bottle in the tray and have been registered before 9am each morning.

Attendance Matters

Being in school every day is extremely important for all children in order to receive the best possible start to their learning. Your child's attendance is vital to a successful education, as this is the foundation for lifelong learning. Lessons are planned in sequences and if a child misses a part of this sequence, they are at a disadvantage when it comes to committing that learning to long term memory.

If your child is slightly under the weather, but well enough to come into school, send them in and mention it to the class teacher. They will keep an eye on your child and phone you if there are any concerns.

Reason for absence

Please let the office know the specific reason for your child's absence rather than feeling unwell or ill. This helps us monitor any small outbreaks of similar virus' and supports the recording of absence.

Medical Appointments

If you have a medical appointment during the school day, inform the school before the appointment and provide a GP/Hospital appointment card or letter.

Leave Requests

Holidays during term time will not be authorised. Any other exceptional circumstances will require supporting evidence that shows the child has to attend something that results in missed school days.

Fixed Penalty Notices (fines) may be triggered if your child misses 5 consecutive days of school or 10 sessions in 10 weeks. A session means a morning or afternoon, not a day.

Please ensure that you make all reasonable efforts to send your child into school.
