Ideas for Learning Chats

What have Reception been learning?

It's been another lively week in Reception, learning our new sounds 'dge' as in 'bridge' and 've' as in 'glove '. We loved welcoming our grown ups into school and played lots of fun things with them.

Ask me to sound out the words 'hedge' and 'live'. Ask me to tell you two numbers that add up to 8. Ask me to tell you some things we can recycle. Ask me to tell you about a game I played with a grown up at school

Next week we will be learning 'wh' in phonics and thinking about 3D shapes in Maths.

What have Year 1 been learning this week, Miss Harris?

Year 1 have loved grown-ups into school week! We were very lucky to have lots of parents come in and help during the week. We have enjoyed painting easter eggs and stained-glass windows, drawing our own farm maps and making easter nests to take home and eat! In phonics we have been looking at different ways to spell the /oa/ sound, in particular focusing on the split digraph o-e as in rose. We have consolidated our learning about how to write a 3 part sentence. In maths we finished our learning about capacity and volume and really enjoyed comparing the capacity of different containers.

Ask me to read the words doe, tiptoe, rose, those, close, froze Ask me to tell you 1 sentence with these three words in: donkey, munching, barn

Ask me to tell you or point out to you 3 signs of spring.

Ask me to tell you what a compass is and the 4 points of a compass.

Ask me to tell you which resource is best for measuring volume or capacity and why: cubes, marbles or water?

Ask me to name three 2D shapes in my environment.

Ask me to name three 3D shapes in my environment.

Next week we are very excited to be going to Odds Farm on our school trip! Ask me to tell you what animals I think I might see there and tell you if they are:

A herbivore (plant eater), carnivore (meat eater) or omnivore (plant and meat eater)

And if they are a:

Mammal (hair or fur), reptile (dry scaly skin), bird (feathers), amphibian (smooth wet skin, lives on land or water) or fish (lives underwater with gills).

What have Year 2 been learning this week?

Ask me what plants need to grow.

Ask me to predict which plant will be healthier; the one in the dark or the one in the light.

Ask me why a chick is a symbol of Easter.

Ask me what the bottom number of a fraction represents (e.g. the 2 in 1/2)

Ask me to tell you my version of 'The Highway Rat'.

Ask me the spelling rule to change an adjective to an adverb (e.g. merry to merrily).

This week has been a busy week. We have been scientists and with the help of our 'adults into school', we have planted seeds ready for our investigation. We have placed one plant pot in a dark place and one pot in a light place. Our investigation is to find out which plant will grow healthier; the one in the dark or the light. Our observations will be recorded in our plant diaries and next week we will be taking our plants home so we can continue with our investigation. In maths, we have been continuing our work on fractions and we have been recognising and finding a third.

Finally, we have been inspired by Julia Donaldson and the story of the Highway Rat. As an author, we have planned and written our own version of the Highway Rat. We have changed the characters the filthy beast met along the highway and we also changed the ending.
