#### Christmas performances



# Ideas for Learning Chats

#### What has been happening in Reception, Mrs Evans

This week we have enjoyed our Christmas performances for our grown-ups. Between performances we have been learning 'u' and 'r' and more about the Nativity story. Our maths focus has been shapes with four straight sides and four corners. We have been looking at ways to be kind, using our words and actions as well as giving gifts and the gifts that were given to baby Jesus.

Ask me to tell you how I felt doing the Christmas performance.

Ask me to tell you the difference between a square and a rectangle.

Ask me to tell you the sounds in 'run'.

Ask me to tell you about the Nativity story.

Ask me to tell you how many days until Christmas.

Next week, we will be reviewing and learning how to use our phonics. We will be doing Christmas crafts and reading Christmas stories. I wonder what other Christmas things we will be doing?

#### What have Year 1 been doing this week, Miss Harris

This week, Year 1 has been learning all about 2D and 3D shapes. They revisited the 2D shapes they learned in Reception and learned some new ones. Year 1 enjoyed making 3D shape trains and describing what shapes they had used. In English, they all had a go at writing a story independently to show off everything they have learned this term about writing a sentence. This week, Year 1 also had their dress rehearsal for their Christmas play which they performed to Reception and Year 2. The children did very well and are excited to perform to their families next week.

Ask me to name some 2D and 3D shapes.

Ask me to describe some shapes using mathematical language eg: edges, vertices, faces.

Ask me to tell you about the story I wrote this week.

Ask me to sing you some songs from our Christmas performance.

Ask me what the 5 senses are.

Ask me to tell you what one more and one less of 4 is.

Ask me to tell you what one more and one less of 7 is.

Ask me to tell you what one more and one less of 3 is.

Next week: we will be continuing to learn all about new 3D shapes.

#### What have Year 2 been doing this week, Mrs Adamcsik

We have been very busy this week but we have made time to sing our hearts out in preparation for our Festive Songs on Wednesday 13th December at 2:30. In class, we have been authors and wrote our own story based on Percy the Park Keeper by Nick Butterworth. We used our imagination to change the setting, the characters and the problem in the story. In geography we have looked at maps and the key and we designed our own map with a key to explain the symbols. We have had fun exploring materials in science. As scientists, we looked at whether the materials were natural or man-made.

Ask me to tell you my story based on Percy the Park Keeper.

Ask me to name some materials objects are made from.

Ask me whether the materials are man-made or natural.

Ask me to name some 3D shapes.

Ask me to describe the properties of a pyramid using the words faces, edges and vertices.

There is no need to request a ticket for this. Just turn up ready to singl




#### At all of our performances there will be a cash collection


