## Ideas for Learning Chats

#### What has been happening in Reception?

We were all very happy to be back at school this week and share news about what we've been doing in the holidays. We hit the ground running learning the new phonics sound /b/ and setting goals for the new year.

Ask me what is a New Year's Resolution and what goal have I set. Ask me to tell you a word that begins with 'b'.

Ask me to show you zero - on a phone or a door etc.

**Next week,** we will be learning the difference between /f/ and /ff/. We will continue to think about zero - subitising, representing and finding one more.

#### What have Year 1 been doing this week, Mrs Kyle?

It has been lovely having Year One back in school after a wonderful Christmas break. We have been very busy practising counting on from 10 in maths lessons this week. We talked about what we got up to in our two week break and wrote a recount. We looked carefully at the parts of a plant by dissecting and labelling them. We also talked about the importance of sleep.

Ask me to count on from 10.

Ask me to read these words: girls, skirt, shirt.

Ask me to tell you the parts of a plant.

Ask me to tell you why it is important to have a good night's sleep.

Next week, we will be planting broad beans.

#### What have Year 2 done this week?

Year 2 have settled into the new term and have remembered their classroom routines brilliantly!

We've been thinking about what starting a new year means and what resolutions are.

We've also been writing Thank You letters to think about how important it is to be grateful for things that we receive.

In maths we've started our new topic of money.

Ask me what my New Year's resolution is.

Ask me what I am grateful for.

Ask me to name all coins we use in the UK.

Ask me to name all of the notes we use in the UK.

Next week we will be starting our new history topic learning about the famous engineer Isambard Kingdom Brunel.
