### What has been happening?

#### Little Alwyn - Reception Children

The children have all settled into Little Alwyn and they have enjoyed using our amazing outdoor space. They are becoming confident using all the areas in Little Alwyn as they make new friends and also spend time with the ones made in Nursery.



#### LOST JUMPERS - Name everything

Some jumpers have already been mislaid. Everything your child wears or brings to school MUST be clearly named. Please do not put initials as one child can often have the same as another child. This includes lunch boxes, water bottles, coats and shoes.

#### Punctuality

A reminder of our starting times. Reception children start at 8.45am and finish at 3.15pm. KS1 children start at 8.50am and finish at 3.20pm. It is very important that children come into school on time and are ready for the start of the school day. It can be disruptive to children emotionally and educationally if they come into a classroom when the lesson has already started and there is not enough time in the day to catch up on missed learning; a lot of learning can take place in 10 minutes! If there is a special circumstance where you know you will be late, please let the office know. All persistent lateness will be followed up.

#### Remember to Order Lunches

If you would like your child to have a school dinner, remember to order it online. The deadline for ordering lunches is 8am on the day.

Please review the menu with your child to check they know what has been chosen for them each day and that they like it. Choose peas or beans, if asked. Lunches for infant age children are fully funded so parents do not pay for them.

If your child does not have a packed lunch, they will be given a jacket potato with beans. We will no longer phone home for lunch orders

#### **Open Door Policy**

Here at Alwyn, we have an 'open door' policy. If you have any questions or concerns about anything at all to do with your child's education or well being, please do not hesitate to talk to the class teacher, phone for a chat or make an appointment if you would like a face to face meeting.

#### Clubs

Our clubs got off to a good start this week. The children have all been joining in enthusiastically and learning new skills. The club leaders will only send children home with an authorised adult. If your child usually goes home with Wise Owls, they tend to be collected first from a different door. If your usual arrangements change, could you please make sure the club leaders are told beforehand. If they are usually collected by Wise Owls and this changes, please remember to inform Wise Owls. Please do not let your child ride a bike or scooter in the playground at the start and the end of the day.





#### My First Class Photo

In a couple of weeks the Maidenhead Advertiser will come into school to take class photos of our new reception children. They will be published in their 'My First Class' feature online and in the paper. If you did not consent to this or the school photographer on our green registration form, you will be asked to complete a google form next week.

#### **Medicines in School**

If your child suffers from Asthma, no matter how mild or severe, we must have a blue inhaler, in school, in case they need it. Please make sure you keep a note of the expiry date. If your child has an allergy, please make sure you tell us about it and if he/she has antihistamine and/or has been prescribed an autoinjector, make sure you bring it to school and complete the form we will give you. It is also extremely important that

you inform us if your child has any food allergies, intolerances, or special dietary requirements.



Any medicines/creams must be handed into the school office. They should not be left in the children's book bags.

If your child is too unwell to come to school please let us know on the first morning of absence by phoning and leaving a message on the absence line or emailing the school office.

If your child has vomiting or diarrhoea, they cannot return to school until 48 hours after the last bout of illness.

Please try to make any medical or dental appointments out of school time so that your child does not miss any lesson time. If it is unavoidable to have an appointment during the day, please bring in the letter so that we can copy it for our records.

If you are planning a family holiday, please make sure that it is during the school holiday time. It is the the RBWM policy that leave taken during term time will be unauthorised unless there are exceptional circumstances that agreed with must be Miss Grierson (Acting Executive Head Teacher), or Mrs Harris (Acting Head of School).

We must now notify the RBWM of families taking holiday during term time.

#### **Road safety and Courtesy**

Parking at drop off and collection times has always been problematic. Please do not park across driveways, or on the pavement. Also the disabled parking bays, are for parents/or children who have a disablity, and even if empty, should not be used. Finally cars should not park in, or block the staff carpark next to the playground as this is a fire escape route.

#### What has been happening in Reception, Mrs Lewis?

This can be a purpose built second hand store in Eastern Europe or South America, or a market stall in East or West Africa, providing valuable employment for importers, warehouse staff, transport companies and stall holders as well as affordable clothes for local people.
