## Ideas for Learning Chats

#### What have Reception been learning?

What a busy week our first full week has been! We have been back into the swing of learning phonics and numbers. We've been thinking about keeping ourselves safe and what clothes we wear in different seasons. We've been very excited to see Mr Baker, our PE teacher and to start a new PE topic.

Ask me to sound out h-u-ff and p-u-ff and read the words Ask me to tell you a story using those two words.

Tell me a number between 0 and 5 and ask me to find that many toys. Ask me to tell you something that is safe to put on my body (e.g. shampoo) and something that is not safe (e.g. a needle).

Ask me to draw a map of my room.

Next week: phonic sounds /l/ and /ll/, thinking about one less than a given number and continuing subitising to five

#### What have Year 1 been learning this week, Mrs Novelle?

It has been a busy week in Year 1. In English, we read our new class book 'Giraffes Can't Dance' and wrote some lovely sentences describing Gerald. In Maths, the children have been exploring numbers up to 20 with lots of hands-on learning in their lessons. In Science, the children planted their own beans! They are excited to look after them and watch them grow over the next few weeks. Well done year 1!

Ask me to count on from 10.

Ask me to tell you one more than 15.

Ask me to tell you one less than 12.

Ask me to read these words: lawn, jaw, peer, deer, appear, claw.

Ask me to tell you what I did when I planted my broad bean seed.

Ask me how I can be a good friend

Ask me to retell the story 'Giraffes Can't Dance.'

Next week, we will be learning all about mammals and birds in Science.

#### What have Year 2 been learning this week?

Year 2 have thoroughly enjoyed their first full week back after the holidays. We've been very excited by our new English topic of Superheros and Villians, we've created our own SuperHero and Villain which we used to write a story using noun phrases and commas in lists.

We've also started a new Art topic learning about the life of Claude Monet, we can't wait to start getting creative.

Ask me how many different ways I can make the following amounts using coins-

10p, 15p, 20p, 25p, 70p

Ask me the names of my Superhero and Villain

Ask me two facts about Claude Monet

Ask me what Brunel was famous for

Next week in Year 2 we will be listening to and reading the story of Peter and the Wolf.



## **NEW PARKING RESOLUTION**

With the start of a brand-new year, it feels like a perfect time to reflect on old habits and make new resolutions, not only of how to keep healthy but also how to keep ourselves and others safe.

With this in mind, the Road Safety
Officers at RBWM have created a
New year, New you, New parking
resolution checklist to remind drivers
of how to park safely and
considerately and the laws regarding
parking especially near schools. The
checklist is included at the end of this
email.





Did you know it's illegal to ride a privately owned electric scooter (e-scooter) in public?



That's because e-scooters are classed as motor vehicles in law. So, in theory, this means that you need an MOT, road tax and insurance to use one, however it isn't currently possible to register e-scooters in this way.

Privately owned e-scooters can only be used on private land, with the permission of the landowner.

You cannot use a privately owned e-scooter on the road, pavement or in a public space. If you do then you risk receiving a large fine, points on your driving licence and your e-scooter could be seized.

Some parts of the UK are running government trials of rental e-scooters. If you're over 16 and have a full or provisional driving licence, then you can use these on public roads and cycle paths.

Just check that your driving licence covers categories AM, A or B.







# NEW PARKING RESOLUTION

## Safer Parking checklist Park further away from school and walk the last 5-15 minutes of ☐ Get active the journey. ☐ Be more considerate Don't block driveways or dropped kerbs even for a few minutes. □ Always park away from junctions and corners Parking 10 meters away increases the visibility for pedestrians and drivers and reduces risks for everyone. ☐ Keep ALL children safe Parking, stopping or dropping on SCHOOL KEEP CLEAR zigzags, even just for a minute, endangers other children. Keep it clear. ☐ Keep yourself within the law Never park on a single yellow line, double yellow line or zig zag line during restricted times. This could lead to a fine.
