# Ideas for Learning Chats

# What has been happening in Reception, Mrs Lewis?

In reception we were very excited to start our Floppy Phonics programme. We have learnt the sound s and a and were excited to get our phonics sheets. Please remember to revise their learning regularly at home. In maths we have

been comparing size, weight and capacity using language such as heavier, lighter, bigger, smaller, full and empty. We have particularly enjoyed filing big and small boxes with various items such as dinosaurs!

Ask me to tell you a word that has 's' in it.

Ask me to tell you what I know about Jesus.

Ask me who can help me if I feel sad.

Ask me to choose two toys and tell you which is heavier and which is lighter. Ask me to help with some baking so we can do some weighing together.

Next week we will be learning the letter sounds 't' and 'p' and will be learning to blend words together such as sat, tap, pat etc. We will also be experimenting with simple repeating patterns such as red, blue, red, blue and up, down, up, down etc.

# What have Year 1 been doing this week, Mrs Novelle

We have had lots of fun watching a toy frozen in ice melt over the day and we also each held an ice block and observed it closely as it melted. We talked about how to make ice melt quicker and came up with super ideas, such as hairdryers, boiling water and putting ice out in the sun. This week we have thoroughly enjoyed making our robots in DT. We have thought about how to join parts together and we can't wait to show you these next week at our Y1 toy museum!

Ask me what the + sign means (to put together).

Ask me what the = sign means (equals/the same as).

Ask me to complete the number story:

First there were 6 sheep in a field. Then 3 more joined. Now there are \_\_\_\_ sheep. Ask me, " what is a verb and then to tell you 3 verbs.?

Ask me to read you the words: argue, continue, true, blue, future, failure, cure Ask me to tell you what happens when water gets really cold (It freezes/ turns to

Ask me to tell you what happens to the snow when it disappears (it melts/ turns back to water).

Next week we will be doing 2 investigations in science! We will be thinking about whether an object will float or sink and whether different materials absorb water. Our second investigation is, 'which material is best for curtains?' Get your child to look at their curtains/blinds. What material is it made from? Does it block out light? Why do you think it's a good material to cover a window?

# What have Year 2 been doing this week, Mrs Adamcik

In Year 2 this week we have been practising extremely hard for our forthcoming Harvest celebration on Friday 20th October at 2.15pm, don't forget to come and see us! Our science has been very exciting as we have been finding out about amphibians. After half term, we'll be exploring the school pond habitat for signs of life. In English we have been retelling the story of the Great Fire of London and have been using conjunctions and expanded noun phrases wonderfully.

Ask me what a conjunction is Ask me to use 'but'in a sentence Ask me to sequence the Great Fire of London Ask me to write the facts families for this set of numbers- 5 2 7

Next week we will be changing the Vlad and the Great Fire of London story using our own setting and characters.



# How IAS can help your parents and carers

## Accessing our service

At Information Advice and Support (IAS) we offer free information, advice and support on all sorts of matters relating to special educational needs and disability (SEND), including education, health and social care. All our advisers are independently trained to provide your parents and carers with accurate information about the law relating to SEND.

A child or young person does NOT need a formal diagnosis to access our support, in fact this is very often the case.

By providing the right advice and support, we will help yorur parents and carers to feel confident to contribute fully to assessments, planning and decisions affecting your child or young person's education, health and social care.

We can provide support for children and young people 25 years old and under, giving information and practical help to make sure their views are heard and included.

We aim to provide you with help that is right for you. This can include:

- · Listening to your views and concerns
- · Giving young people a voice
- · Helping you feel more confident to express your views
- · Explaining the law and your options, rights and responsibilities
- · Helping with forms, letters and reports
- · Helping prepare for meetings and/or attending meetings with you
- Answering your questions about Special Educational Needs and Educational Health Care (EHC) Plans
- · Supporting you through Needs Assessment or Review
- · Supporting you to resolve disagreements
- . Signposting you to other networks or services that may be of help

Our service is accessible to everyone who needs it and lives in the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead and we will respond as flexibly as we can to cater to individual circumstances and needs.
