# **Ideas for Learning Chats**

### What have Reception been learning?

We had great fun dressing up as book characters and working out who our teachers were dressed up as. We've really enjoyed watching the chicks grow and were thrilled to be able to hold one.

Ask me to sound out the words 'chick' and 'shop'. Ask me to tell you about the chicks we have at school. Ask me to tell you how I can look after my friends. Ask me to find you 9 socks and tell you if 9 is an odd or an even number.

Next week we will be learning 'th' and 'ng' in phonics and thinking further about 9 and 10 in Maths.

### What have Year 1 been learning this week, Mrs Kyle?

This week we had a wonderful time celebrating World Book Day. We really enjoyed dressing up as our favourite book characters and doing a fun drama activity. We continued to visit our special visitors this week, the chicks! We have been watching them grow and learning all about their life cycle. We have explored ways in which we can look after our planet and care for the environment around us and continued to explore Maidenhead as a settlement in our geography lessons. What a great week we've had!

Ask me to read these words: funny, equals, trolley, field, reach, swede

Next week we are going to be learning about capacity and weight.

### What have Year 2 been learning this week?

Year 2 have had an exciting and tiring week with a trip and World Book Day! In maths we have been learning about mass and how to measure it. We learnt that you can measure in grams and kilograms and have used balance scales.

In Science we have been naming the parts of a plant and found out that trees are also plants but they are just bigger and have different parts.

Ask me to name the parts of a plant Ask me to name some trees

Ask me to tell you which is heavier- a gram or a kilogram Ask me how we measure mass

Ask me to name the 5 oceans of the world Ask me to name the ocean that is between Europe and North America

Next week we will be learning about what plants need to survive.
