What have Reception been learning?

It's been another lively week in Reception, learning 'wh' in phonics and looking at the features of 3D shapes. We have enjoyed exploring lots of fun Easter crafts and even had a go at curling in PE with Mr Baker!

Ask me to sound out the word 'whip'
Ask me to tell you what makes a shape 3D
Ask me to tell you what Christians think is the miracle of Easter
Ask me to tell you why we need money

After the holidays we will be learning 'tch' and 'nk' in phonics and thinking about numbers beyond 10 in Maths

What have Year 1 been learning this week?

Year 1 have been learning about seasonal changes in Spring and have been tracking the weather this week. Look out for the Science holiday homework to track the weather for a week of the holidays so we can talk further about the changes in Spring when we return after the Easter Holiday. We were also really lucky to have the opportunity to see lots of lovely spring animals on our visit to Odds Farm this week. We followed up our visit by writing a recount. In Maths we spent a lot of time talking about counting and discussing how counting forward in 1s means adding 1 each time, counting in 2s means adding 2 each time. We look forward to continuing to practise our counting next term!

Ask me to tell you what the three parts of the sentences are that we wrote this week.

Ask me to count backwards from any number up to 100 in ones.

Ask me to count forwards in 2s, 5s and 10s.

Ask me what the weather was like on our visit to Odds Farm.

Ask me what first aid means.

What have Year 2 been learning this week?

Year 2 have had lots of fun creating posters to compare the continents of Europe and Antarctica. They researched many facts relating to climate, landmarks and population.

We've also been investigating equivalent fractions in maths and found out that a half is the same as two quarters!

In RE ,we enjoyed looking at the symbols of Easter and recalled facts from Reverend David's talk last week.

Ask me a fact about Antarctica Ask me a fact about Europe

Ask me what the symbols of Easter are Ask me to tell you the Easter story

Ask me to tell you what a unit and non unit fraction are
Ask me to tell you what the numerator and denominator are in a fraction

After the Easter holidays we will be learning about Florence Nightingale.


