What has been happening?

Sports Fortnight starts next week

This term, Caterlink are completing a Parent/Guardian survey on



What have Reception been learning this week?

This week in Reception we have been continuing to explore people who help us and using this knowledge to think about what we might like to be when we grow up. Today we had a visit from some real Police Officers who are parents of a reception child. We have been learning to use a rekenrek to help us with our numbers - we have had a lot of fun! We have also done some pop art printing based on Andy Warhol, using repeated patterns and a limited colour palette-which was jolly messy! On Thursday we had a visiting artist who showed us how to make pinch pots - he will be coming back to work with all classes. We have continued to look at ways we can keep healthy such as brushing teeth and exercise - which leads us nicely into Sports Fortnight.

Ask me to sound out and read the words 'green' and 'snail'.

Ask me to sound out and write "A bee on a train."

Ask me to tell you about a rekenrek

Ask me to tell you how a lifeguard helps us.

Ask me to tell you what I would like to be when I grow up.

Next week Reception will be revising igh and oa in phonics and continue to develop their subitising skills and use of the rekenrek in Maths

What have Year 1 been learning this week?

This week we have been very busy with our phonics screening test. The children tried really hard and they should be very proud of themselves. In maths, we continued learning about money and making amounts using coins and notes. In English, we learnt two different poems by Edward Lear this week - "The Owl and the Pussycat' and "Calico Pie". We then wrote our own version of "Calico Pie" as a whole class and the children performed it in front of their friends. In geography, we revisited the countries in the UK and learnt the names of the seas and ocean that surrounds the UK. In science, we have been learning about the changes that happen to our environment during the summer.

Ask me how to make 15p, 23p and 56p. (please encourage your child to handle money so they become more familiar with the different values of coins and notes)

Ask me to share the poem we have written in class.

Ask me to name the different seas and oceans that surround the UK. Ask me to tell you about the different changes that happen during the summer.

Next week, it's the start of sports fortnight and we've got some very exciting sporting events going on, such as; tennis, cricket and Bollybanghra zumba. We can't wait!

What have Year 2 been learning this week?

Year 2 have had a fabulous week as we went on our trip to Wellington Country Park! We thoroughly enjoyed ourselves and had brilliant weather. We took part in a bug detectives workshop in the woods. We had to look under leaves and logs to find different types of minibeasts. We found slugs, snails, woodlouse and many more. One of our favourite parts of the trip was meeting the farm animals, there were alpacas, goats, pigs, chickens and even guinea pigs. Thank you to all of our adult helpers.

We've also had a very busy time in maths learning about temperature, capacity and mass.

We did lots of practical work, measuring water, using real thermometers in hot water and weighing various objects from around the school.

Ask me to tell you 2 facts about a minibeast I found during the bug detective workshop.

Ask me to tell you what instrument we use to measure temperature. Ask me to tell you what unit of measurement we use when recording temperature.

Ask me to tell you the difference between mass and weight.

Ask me to tell you the unit of measurement used when recording a container's capacity.

Next week is the start of Sports Fortnight, we will be taking part in cricket and Zumba to name but a few!

The School Gates

The Alwyn and Courthouse gates open at 8.40am until 8.55am and 3.10pm until 3.35pm

The opening times allow movement between our two schools and provide different points of access which should help with traffic and parking in our area.

The gate opening times are different from the time your child is required to be in school.

The Importance of Being on Time

Reception children need to be in school at 8.45am.

Year 1 and 2 children need to be in school at 8.50am.

The classroom doors will open at these times and close as soon as the last child in the line enters the classroom; this usually takes less than 3 minutes. Any child arriving after the classroom door is shut, will be marked as late. Knocking on the classroom door once it is closed is disruptive to the children as their teacher is having to keep opening the door instead of settling their class for the morning.

Please be on time every morning. It can be worrying for a child to enter a classroom late especially when their classmates are sat on the carpet ready to learn. All children should have come into school, put their belongings in the cloakroom, their book bag in their drawer and their water bottle in the tray and have been registered before 9am each morning.

Attendance Matters

Being in school every day is extremely important for all children in order to receive the best possible start to their learning. Your child's attendance is vital to a successful education, as this is the foundation for lifelong learning. Lessons are planned in sequences and if a child misses a part of this sequence, they are at a disadvantage when it comes to committing that learning to long term memory.

If your child is slightly under the weather, but well enough to come into school, send them in and mention it to the class teacher. They will keep an eye on your child and phone you if there are any concerns.

Reason for absence

Please let the office know the specific reason for your child's absence rather than feeling unwell or ill. This helps us monitor any small outbreaks of similar virus' and supports the recording of absence.

Medical Appointments

If you have a medical appointment during the school day, inform the school before the appointment and provide a GP/Hospital appointment card or letter.

Leave Requests

Holidays during term time will not be authorised. Any other exceptional circumstances will require supporting evidence that shows the child has to attend something that results in missed school days.

Fixed Penalty Notices (fines) may be triggered if your child misses 5 consecutive days of school or 10 sessions in 10 weeks. A session means a morning or afternoon, not a day.

Please ensure that you make all reasonable efforts to send your child into school.

Penalty Notice Changes

With t he introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices on 19 August 2024 there are significant changes in the way that Penalty Notices are to be issued and an increase in the charges associated with them. These are nationwide changes implemented for consistency across all Local Authorities.

Term Time Leave is only allowed in exceptional circumstances communicated in advance with evidence provided as soon as possible to the Headteacher.

First Offence

For the first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be;

- -£160 per parent per child paid within 28 days.
- -Reduced to £80 per parent if paid within 21 days.



Please ensure you communicate all absences for your child to school.

Second Offence

Within 3 years of the first offence. The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be;

- -£160 per parent per child paid within 28 days.
- -No reduction for early payment.

Third Offence Onwards – Within 3 years of the first offence

The third time an offence is committed for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the magistrates court. Fines can be around £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found to be guilty in the magistrate's court can show as a criminal record.

Notices to Improve

A Notice to Improve is a final opportunity for a parent to engage in support and improve before a penalty notice is issued. If the national threshold has been met and support is appropriate but offers of support have not been engaged with by the parent or guardian or have not worked, a Notice to Improve should usually be sent to give parents or guardians a final chance to engage in support. A Notice to Improve does not need to be issued in cases where support is not appropriate and an authorised officer can choose not to issue one in any case, including cases where support is appropriate but they do not expect a Notice to Improve would have any behavioural impact (because the parent has already received one for a similar offence).

If sufficient improvement is not made following the service of a Notice to Improve, a penalty notice may be issued either during or at the end of the designated time period.

Don't forget.

Penalty Notices are issues Per Parent, Per Child.
For example 3 siblings absent would result in each parent receiving 3 fines. This could amount to £960

Driving, Parking and Vehicles in Mulberry Walk

Please think about our neighbours and school community, especially as one of our school values is kindness. Drive and park carefully and considerately on the roads surrounding the school at all times.

The road gets very busy at drop off and collection times. To help with this, we have an unofficial one way system that keep cars moving safely. Please reduce your speed and drive slowly around the one-way system. This is crucial as there are very young children walking along the pavements who may not be seen easily while driving, especially in these grey days.

We have good relationships with our neighbours but that can only be maintained with your help. Please do not block their driveways when parking and remain polite if they ask you to move. Any area with block paving is for the residents of the road and not for school parking or access.

Please do not park on the bends of the road or directly opposite another car as this can stop the flow of traffic and make it difficult for other drivers to pass.

Do not mount the curb as our children and their siblings are very little and not always easy to see.

To ease congestion, please explore other options:

- If you are able to walk or cycle to school this would help.
- Consider parking further away, such as by Courthouse Junior School, where there are more roads to park along safely and they tend to be less congested.
- A short walk can make a significant difference in reducing traffic and ensuring safety and you can access Alwyn by walking through Courthouse as the gate opening times are the same.

Recently we've had a few reports of members of our school community driving along the pavement, on the bend, at speed resulting in near misses as well as some aggressive behaviours when they have been reminded of our parking etiquette.

Aggressive driving and behaviours put us all at risk and should be reported by calling 101.
