Ideas for Learning Chats

What has been happening in Reception, Mrs Palmer?

In Reception we have continued our Phonics learning with two more letter sounds - 't' and 'p' and have even started learning to blend sounds together to read very simple words. We have enjoyed copying and continuing patterns with all sorts of objects from pine cones to Numicon. We have talked about different emotions and expressing how we're feeling in PSHE.

Ask me to tell you a word beginning with 't' and one that ends with 't' Ask me to sound out the word 'p-a-t'

Ask me to make a pattern with actions eg tap your head, shrug your shoulders (repeat)

Ask me what to do when I feel sad

Ask me who Bertie Owl is.

After half term we will be continuing to learn our letter sounds with 'i' and 'n'. In maths we will be finding numbers 1,2 and 3 and learning how to recognise them without counting. We will also be starting our P.E. lessons with Mr Baker - just a reminder that the children don't need to wear P.E. clothes.

What have Year 1 been doing this week, Mrs Alston

This week we enjoyed inviting parents in to share our Toy Museums. We thought about what toys from the past were made out of, how they were played with and what age children might have played with the toys. We compared toys from the past with our toys now and answered the questions that our adults asked. We had great fun evaluating our robots and a very exciting visit from a fantastic mummy from Beech class who brought two amazing robots from her engineering university to visit Year 1. One small robot which was sensor controlled, and one called K1, which was programmed to respond to voice commands. How exciting!

Ask me to tell you about the two robots which visited our school this week. Ask me to tell you what makes a good sentence.

Ask me to tell you a math's first, then, now story (first there were 3, then another 2 came, now there are 5)

Ask me to tell you a fact family (2 + 4 = 6, 4 + 2 = 6, 6 - 2 = 4, 6 = 4 + 2).

Next week: After half term, we will be using the book 'Dear Zoo' to inspire our writing. Please chat to your children about names of different animals that they might find in a zoo.

What have Year 2 been doing this week, Mrs Booth

This week we have had great fun writing our innovated Vlad and the Great Fire of Maidenhead story. We have changed the characters and the place where the fire started. The children have been very creative and brought their stories to life using expanded noun phrases. Sadly, it is our last week learning about 'The Great Fire of London'. This week we have learnt about the changes which were made when London was rebuilt, ensuring that there would never be a repeat of such a devastating event. The children have really enjoyed learning about this famous historical event. In RE, we have continued to think about what it means to be kind and how we can be kind to everyone all of the time. We each wrote an 'act of kindness' note for the class and one will be picked and read out each morning next term for us to do throughout the day.

Ask me what a multiple of 10 is.

Ask me how to work out 45 + 30 =.

Ask me to tell you my innovated Vlad and the Great Fire of Maidenhead story. Ask me what changes were made as a result of the Great Fire of London. Ask me what my chosen 'act of kindness' was for the class.

After half term we will be looking at instructions and writing our own set of instructions.

We hope you are well and keeping warm now the weather has turned.


