We are looking forward to our parent and carer meetings next week. This is a chance for you to hear how your child has settled into their new year group and ask any questions you may have about their learning or the expectations.

We are so pleased to have our first parents'/carers' meetings next week. We have them quite early in the term so we can talk about how your child has settled into their new class and answer any questions you may have. The sessions are only 10 minutes per child and the appointments are made via our app/online, 'My Child at School' (MCAS). Make sure you have booked a slot. Please ensure you arrive on time as we will not be able to offer any alternative times on the day.

#### After school book fair next week

Come to the book sale in the school, at 3.30pm from Monday 6th October until Friday 10th October. Pop in any day or every day to browse and buy from a great range of age appropriate reading books. The books are also available to buy during our two parents evening sessions.

We are trying to be cashless so all purchases can be made on the day via scanning a QR code and entering your details or with the card payment machine. A percentage of the sales goes towards the purchase of new books for our school too!

#### Open Door Policy

Here at Alwyn, we have an 'open door' policy so if you have any questions or concerns about anything at all to do with your child's education or well being, please do not hesitate to talk to the class teacher. The beginning of the day is not always the best time as the teachers will be focusing on getting the children settled, but a quick email requesting a chat or sharing information works well.

## Responsible Behaviour Curriculum in Alwyn and Courthouse


Our vision is to develop well rounded, confident and responsible children who aspire to achieve their full potential. We want our children to do their best in all aspects of school life - work, play, friendships and behaviour, and to take pride in all they do. We want them to develop respect and a sense of responsibility for themselves, each other, property, the wider community and the environment. To support this aim, we follow a behaviour curriculum that is explicitly taught and also weaves throughout the whole of school life.

Each week, the classes explore a different theme. They have a Monday 'check-in' circle time to introduce it and set a goal to work towards throughout the week. On Tuesday, the Year 1 and 2 assembly is time to think about the whole school approach to the theme. They celebrate their successes with a Friday 'check-out' circle time in their class.

To support this learning, there is a weekly leaflet for parents (below) to introduce the theme and sometimes gives ideas on how to help.

THIS WEEK'S TOPIC IS

### COPING WITH EMOTIONS





#### Emotional regulation

- Emotional regulation is a hard part of growing up. We need to learn how to do it to keep ourselves and others safe and to have respectful relationships when we grow up.
- Children often mimic the emotional behaviour of those around them and so being a good role model and explaining your feelings is important.

#### Talking about emotions

- Children need to learn how to talk about their emotions.
- Anger, sadness or overwhelm are all normal emotions and we should talk about how we can try to regulate them but not feel bad for feeling them.
- Using lots of vocabulary about emotions helps children learn how to explain their feelings. E.g. don't just use angry, use furious, cross, annoyed etc.











#### Mindfulness

- Children in KS2 will have been talking about mindful breathing.
- This is a technique to practise every day that can help to regulate emotions when they occur. People who practise this are known to feel less stressed.
- Try practising mindful activities with your child/children such as mindful breathing or mindful colouring.

These zones of regulation are also a great way to help the children think about and identify their feelings, along with an idea to help manage them.

### What have Reception been learning this week?

This week in Reception we have been finding out about wolves, describing the big, bad wolf using nouns and adjectives e.g. He has a pointy, black nose and golden eyes. In Science, we have been finding out about parts of our body and learning a song about our bodies. In Maths we have been using the words big and small and setting a picnic for big bear and little bear. In Phonics we have learnt the sounds i and n.

**Ask me a word beginning with the i sound.**

**Ask me a word beginning with the n sound.**

**Ask me to describe the big bad wolf.**

**Ask me to sing you the song 'I've got a body...a very busy body'.**

**Ask me what handwriting shapes we have been practising.**

Next week we will be starting a new book called 'You Choose' during booktime. We will be finding out about where the children would like to go, who they would like to take with them and what they would pack. The children will learn the new sounds m and d in phonics and will be continuing to match, sort and compare in maths. We look forward to seeing you at parent's evening!

### What have Year 1 been learning this week?

This week the Year 1 children have been busy delving into brilliant adjectives to describe the Tiger from 'Tiger who came to tea' and have even created their own new animals with descriptive labels. They have explored one more and one less in maths using concrete resources such as tens frames, objects and number lines to support them. The children enjoyed learning about the history of the first teddy bear and how they have evolved over the years. Furthermore, we started to look at natural objects found on Earth and what Christians believe about creation. What an exciting week we've had!

**Ask me to describe the tiger's eyes, claws and tail.**

**Ask me to tell you what an adjective is.**

**Ask me to play 'one more, one less'. What's one more than 11?**

**What's one less than 9?**

**Ask me to count up to 20 starting at a random number.**

**Ask me who was the first teddy bear named after.**

**Ask me how it feels to make a creation from Lego.**

## What have Year 2 been learning this week?

This week Year 2 have written a setting description in English. We used the skills learned over the past few weeks to describe a setting of our choice. We used, alliteration, prepositional language, expanded noun phrases and similes.

In Science, we have moved onto amphibians. We have learnt about their needs for survival and what characteristics make them amphibians, for example, they live in water and on land.

**Ask me to tell you why the Great Fire of London lasted so long.**

**Ask me to tell you why the Great Fire of London spread so far.**

**Ask me to tell you what amphibians needs for survival are.**

**Ask me to tell you the characteristics that amphibians have.**

**Ask me to tell you the difference between amphibians and mammals.**

**Ask me to count in steps of 3 from 0 to 30.**

**Ask me to tell you how many 2-digit numbers I can make with the following digits 4 6 8- for example 68.**

Next week we will be learning about reptiles in Science

## MAIDENHEAD TOWN SHOW 2025

At the 11th Maidenhead Town Show in October 2024, we raised an amazing **£3,555 for Thames Valley Adventure Playground** - almost double our previous year's charity total! 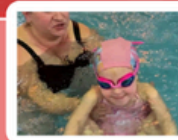

# Penalty Notice Changes

Term Time Leave is only allowed in exceptional circumstances and must be agreed, in advance, by the Head of School. An Exceptional Leave form must be completed and the school may ask for further evidence to support the application.

## First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:

- £160 per parent, per child, paid within 28 days.
- Reduced to £80 per parent if paid within 21 days.



**Please ensure you communicate all absences for your child to school.**

## Second Offence

Within 3 years, if a second Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be

- £160 per parent, per child, paid within 28 days.
- No reduction for early payment.

## Third Offence Onwards - Within 3 years of the first offence

The third time an offence is committed for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the magistrates court.

Fines can be around £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found to be guilty in the magistrate's court can show as a criminal record.

## Notices to Improve

A Notice to Improve is a final opportunity for a parent to engage in support and improve before a penalty notice is issued. If the national threshold has been met and support is appropriate but offers of support have not been engaged with by the parent or guardian or have not worked, a Notice to Improve should usually be sent to give parents or guardians a final chance to engage in support.

A Notice to Improve does not need to be issued in cases where support is not appropriate and an authorised officer can choose not to issue one in any case, including cases where support is appropriate but they do not expect a Notice to Improve would have any behavioural impact (because the parent has already received one for a similar offence).

If sufficient improvement is not made following the service of a Notice to Improve, a penalty notice may be issued either during or at the end of the designated time period.

## Don't forget.

Penalty Notices are issues Per Parent, Per Child.  
For example 3 siblings absent would result in each parent receiving 3 fines. This could amount to £960

## 10 sessions in 10 weeks

Penalty Notices will be considered for any 10 sessions (not days) of unauthorised absence in 10 weeks.

**5 Consecutive days** of term time leave can trigger a Penalty Notice

## Punctuality

Children in Reception should be at the classroom door by 8.45am.

Children in Years 1 and 2 should be at their classroom door by 8.50am.

The school gates are locked at 8.55am. If your child arrives to school after this time, your child will receive an unauthorised late mark- this affects your child's attendance.

If arriving late, you must bring your child into the school office and sign them into school with a reason for the lateness.

## The School Gates

The Alwyn and Courthouse gates open at 8.40am until 8.55am and 3.10pm until 3.35pm

The opening times allow movement between our two schools and provide different points of access which should help with traffic and parking in our area.

The gate opening times are different from the time your child is required to be in school.

## The Importance of Being on Time

**Reception children need to be in school by 8.45am.**

**Year 1 and 2 children need to be in school by 8.50am.**

The classroom doors will open at these times and close as soon as the last child in the line enters the classroom; this usually takes less than 3 minutes. Any child arriving after the classroom door is shut, will be marked as late. Knocking on the classroom door once it is closed is disruptive to the children as their teacher is having to keep opening the door instead of settling their class for the morning.

Please be on time every morning. It can be worrying for a child to enter a classroom late especially when their classmates are sat on the carpet ready to learn. All children should have come into school, put their belongings in the cloakroom, their book bag in their drawer and their water bottle in the tray and have been registered before 9am each morning.

## Attendance Matters

Being in school every day is extremely important for all children in order to receive the best possible start to their learning. Your child's attendance is vital to a successful education, as this is the foundation for lifelong learning. Lessons are planned in sequences and if a child misses a part of this sequence, they are at a disadvantage when it comes to committing that learning to long term memory.

If your child is slightly under the weather, but well enough to come into school, send them in and mention it to the class teacher. They will keep an eye on your child and phone you if there are any concerns.

## Reason for absence

Please let the office know the specific reason for your child's absence rather than feeling unwell or ill. This helps us monitor any small outbreaks of similar virus' and supports the recording of absence.

## Medical Appointments

If you have a medical appointment during the school day, inform the school before the appointment and provide a GP/Hospital appointment card or letter.

## Leave Requests

Holidays during term time will not be authorised. Any other exceptional circumstances will require supporting evidence that shows the child has to attend something that results in missed school days.

Fixed Penalty Notices (fines) may be triggered if your child misses 5 consecutive days of school or 10 sessions in 10 weeks. A session means a morning or afternoon, not a day.

Please ensure that you make all reasonable efforts to send your child into school.
