## Non-Uniform Day

### Jessica's Journey at John Radcliffe Hospital

Over the past 3 years, Jessica has spent some time at the John Radcliffe Children's Hospital, where she received treatment and surgery for hip dysplasia. What could have been a very frightening experience for a young child was made so much easier because of the incredible care and kindness shown by the staff there.

From the moment we arrived, the nurses, doctors and play team made Jessica feel safe, comfortable and cared for. The hospital has dedicated play nurses who spend time with the children throughout the day, helping them to smile even during difficult moments. They play games, read stories and sit with the children if parents need a short break, which is such a huge support for families.



The ward is filled with toys, activities and books, many of which are donated by the charity Read for Good. These small acts of kindness make a big difference to children spending long periods of time in hospital. For children staying on the ward for the foreseeable future, lessons and school supplies are also provided so they can continue learning and not miss out on their education. Seeing the care, patience and compassion from everyone on the ward has been truly inspiring.

The staff do far more than provide medical treatment. They bring comfort, reassurance and happiness to children and their families during some of their hardest days. We would love to give something back through fundraising to help support these amazing services and the wonderful work they do every single day.

## Responsible Behaviour Curriculum in Alwyn and Courthouse

Our vision is to develop well rounded, confident and responsible children who aspire to achieve their full potential. We want our children to do their best in all aspects of school life - work, play, friendships and behaviour, and to take pride in all they do. We want them to develop respect and a sense of responsibility for themselves, each other, property, the wider community and the environment. To support this aim, we follow a behaviour curriculum that is explicitly taught and also weaves throughout the whole of school life.

Each week, the classes explore a different theme. They have a Monday 'check-in' circle time to introduce it and set a goal to work towards throughout the week. On Tuesday, the Year 1 and 2 assembly is time to think about the whole school approach to the theme. They celebrate their successes with a Friday 'check-out' circle time in their class.

To support this learning, there is a weekly leaflet for parents (below) to introduce the theme and sometimes gives ideas on how to help.

**Words have power**

Speaking to children about the impact of their words is an important part of them growing up. Everyone is entitled to an opinion but if sharing that opinion causes upset and hurt, then we should keep them to ourselves. In school this week, children have been talking about the power and impact of their words.

**Today's online world**

We ALL want to be liked by others. This is built into our brains from thousands of years ago when we lived in tribes and had to be accepted by our group or face isolation. What other people think of us has always mattered but in today's society where people's opinions can be read or heard by millions of others online in the blink of an eye, worrying about what other's think of us can become overwhelming. Being spoken about online or in what's app groups can feel like the end of the world to our children.









**What can you do?**

- Model using positive language about others and giving people compliments.
- Discuss the impact of putting things out there online, talk about how once they are online - you can never take it back.
- Support your child to behave well towards others so that they are well thought of.
- Build your child's self-esteem so that if someone else has a poor opinion of them, it has little effect.

These zones of regulation are also a great way to help the children think about and identify their feelings, along with an idea to help manage them.

### What have Reception been learning this week?

This week as you know it has been a very hot week. We have been ensuring that all children stay cool and hydrated. The children have been going outside first thing in the morning and encouraged to play in the shady areas and have had lots of opportunities for water play.

We have been revising our letter sounds and writing helpful words. During talk for writing the children have been reading 'Martha Maps It Out' and creating their own maps and plans.

**Ask me to read the helpful words I, the, go, no, to and into.**

**Ask me a way of staying safe in the sun.**

**Ask me to count to 20.**

**Ask me to form the letter z and make zigzag shapes.**

**Ask me about what we would find in a church.**

Next week the children will be continuing to learn map skills and make their own house plan. If you could talk to your children about the different rooms in your house and what they might put in their dream bedroom this would help. We will be learning about bees and how they help pollinate flowers. We will be creating bee artwork and creating save the bees posters!

### What have Year 1 been learning this week?

This week, Year 1 have continued to enjoy Sports Fortnight, including trying Zumba for the first time! In DT, the children explored weaving and created some excellent paper patterns inspired by the artist Margo Selby. In English, following our work on Katie in London, the children planned their own adaptation of the story, featuring a character in Maidenhead! This linked beautifully with our Geography topic, where we have been exploring UK landmarks, identifying both physical and human features, and comparing towns and cities. In Maths, the children have been learning to recognise coins and notes and understand their values - always an enjoyable topic! They worked practically to add amounts and order coins from the smallest value to the largest. What a busy week we've had!

**Ask me who is my character in the Maidenhead story and one place they visit on their journey.**

**Ask me which coin has the greatest value.**

**Ask me what is the total of 2p, 5p, 10p and 20p.**

**Ask me something that Margo Selby includes in her weaving (e.g. colour, shape, material)**

**Ask me my favourite sports activity in Sports Fortnight.**

Next week we will be looking at the importance of Jewish new year Rosh Hashanah and continue writing and editing our journey stories.

# Penalty Notice Changes

Term Time Leave is only allowed in exceptional circumstances and must be agreed, in advance, by the Head of School. An Exceptional Leave form must be completed and the school may ask for further evidence to support the application.

## First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:

- £160 per parent, per child, paid within 28 days.
- Reduced to £80 per parent if paid within 21 days.



**Please ensure you communicate all absences for your child to school.**

## Second Offence

Within 3 years, if a second Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be

- £160 per parent, per child, paid within 28 days.
- No reduction for early payment.

## Third Offence Onwards - Within 3 years of the first offence

The third time an offence is committed for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the magistrates court.

Fines can be around £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found to be guilty in the magistrate's court can show as a criminal record.

## Notices to Improve

A Notice to Improve is a final opportunity for a parent to engage in support and improve before a penalty notice is issued. If the national threshold has been met and support is appropriate but offers of support have not been engaged with by the parent or guardian or have not worked, a Notice to Improve should usually be sent to give parents or guardians a final chance to engage in support.

A Notice to Improve does not need to be issued in cases where support is not appropriate and an authorised officer can choose not to issue one in any case, including cases where support is appropriate but they do not expect a Notice to Improve would have any behavioural impact (because the parent has already received one for a similar offence).

If sufficient improvement is not made following the service of a Notice to Improve, a penalty notice may be issued either during or at the end of the designated time period.

**Don't forget.** Penalty Notices are issued Per Parent, Per Child. For example 3 siblings absent would result in each parent receiving 3 fines. This could amount to £960

## 10 sessions in 10 weeks

Penalty Notices will be considered for any 10 sessions (not days) of unauthorised absence in 10 weeks.

**5 Consecutive days** of term time leave can trigger a Penalty Notice



## Punctuality

Children in Reception should be at the classroom door by 8.45am.

Children in Years 1 and 2 should be at their classroom door by 8.50am.

If your child arrives to school after these times, your child will receive an unauthorised late mark- this affects your child's attendance. The school gates are locked at 9am.

If arriving late, you must bring your child into the school office and sign them into school with a reason for the lateness.
